310 Permitting Process

Use this checklist to submit a complete Joint Application and coordinate related permits before work begins.

DISTRICT SUBMISSION

Submit your Joint Application to the District

Fill out the Joint Application, also known as the 310 application, completely. Include maps and photos. Email it to admin@stillwatercd.org or deliver it to the Stillwater Conservation District at **334 N. 9th Street, Columbus, MT**. Please call **406-290-1544** before coming in to be sure staff is available.

FWP AUTHORIZATION

Fish, Wildlife & Parks - 318 authorization

After the District accepts your Joint Application, the District will forward it to Fish, Wildlife & Parks for 318 authorization. Contact: **Bryan Giordano**, 406-698-1905, bryan.giordano@mt.gov.

FLOODPLAIN REVIEW

Stillwater County Floodplain Permit

FEDERAL REVIEW

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers - Section 404 / Section 10

You must submit your Joint Application through the **USACE Regulatory Request System** or email it to Montana.Reg@usace.army.mil. The Corps will assign a contact person for your Section 404 / Section 10 permit review.

YELLOWSTONE RIVER PROJECTS

DNRC Navigable Rivers Land Use Authorization

If your project is on the Yellowstone River, contact the **DNRC Southern Land Office** for a Navigable Rivers Land Use License, Lease, or Easement. Phone: **406-247-4400**. Website: dnrc.mt.gov/licenses-and-permits/stream-permitting/

Before work begins

It is your responsibility to have all required permits granted and valid before beginning your project. Complete applications must be submitted to the District at least **7 days before the monthly board meeting** and inspected prior to that meeting. District board meetings are open to the public, and applicants are welcome to attend.
