## 310 Permitting Process

Fill out your Joint Application also known as the 310 application completely including maps and photos and email or deliver it to the Stillwater Conservation District at 334 N. 9<sup>th</sup> Street Columbus MT.

Once the Stillwater Conservation District has accepted your Joint Application we will forward it to Fish, Wildlife & Parks for your 318 authorization.

You MUST email your Joint Application to Army Corp. of Engineers to [montana.reg@usace.army.mil](mailto:montana.reg@usace.army.mil) they will assign you a contact person for your Section 404/Section 10 Permit

If your project is on the Yellowstone River you must contact the DNRC Area Office for a Navigable Rivers Land Use License, Lease, or Easement at 406-247-4400 Website: <https://dnrc.mt.gov/licenses-and-permits/stream-permitting/>

It is your responsibility to have all permits granted and valid before you begin your project. If you have questions or need help submitting to other agencies the Stillwater Conservation District is happy to help. Applications must be turned in by Noon seven days prior to the regular first Tuesday of the month Board Meeting to be considered for approval at that meeting. A site inspection will be done the Thursday before the Board Meeting by Stillwater Conservation District Staff, Board Members, and FWP. Board meetings are open to the public and you are welcome to attend.
